- Targeted intervention in the teaching of reading and writing (Student Management Assessment and Adjustment Referral Team - SMAaART referral process implemented by staff).
- School participation in the South East Region Leading Learning Collaborative Project (focussed on improving reading and writing Prep-2).
- Data driven timetabled Professional Learning Teams led by HOC and supported by Senior Leadership Team.
- Provision for professional development for a comprehensive understanding of PBL.
- Continuation of Zones of Regulation in all classrooms.
- Enact 2019 Attendance Policy to maintain 90% attendance goal.
- Continue to develop and enhance strong and sustainable community partnerships (inclusive of Queensland Police Service, Communities for Children - The Salvation Army, Kingston East Neighbourhood Group, Mob Kinnectors, Logan Together, local childcare providers, Bunnings, YMCA, Logan Rotary, PCYC and White Bear Foundation.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Purchasing human resources (inclusive of: 0.5 Deputy Principal, 1.0 Pedagogical Coach, 0.4 Full-time Guidance Officer, 0.1 Speech Pathologist, 1.0 STLaN, 1.0 classroom teacher, Attendance Officer, Positive Behaviour for Learning support staff, Teacher Aides and physical resources to support our 2019 School Improvement Agenda: Australian Curriculum English: Reading and Writing, to the cost of \$430,000.
- Professional Development targeted to our Explicit Improvement Agenda to the cost of \$25,000.
- Early Years focus: Pre-prep program and associated resourcing for EYNN participation \$5,000.
- Wellbeing initiatives for staff and students aligned with our school's vision, *Every student, in class, learning* and continued development of community partnerships \$10,228.
