INTERNET AND EMAIL ACCESS AGREEMENT

The school encourages students to become familiar with the use of information technology. This agreement must be signed by students and parents/guardians and returned to the school's main office. Parents/guardians are encouraged to contact the appropriate personnel at the school if they require more information about this form.

Student – Internet

I understand that the internet can connect me to useful information stored on computers around the world.

While I have access to the internet:

1. I will use it only for educational purposes.
2. I will not look for anything that is illegal, dangerous or offensive.
3. If I accidentally come across something that is illegal, dangerous or offensive, I will:
 - (a) Clear any offensive pictures or information from my screen; and
 - (b) Immediately, quietly, inform my teacher.
4. I will not reveal home addresses or phone numbers – mine or anyone else.
5. I will not reveal my password to any person.
6. I will not use the internet to annoy or offend anyone else.
7. I will observe all copyright laws, including those relating to computer software.
8. I understand that if the school decides I have broken these rules, appropriate action will be taken. This may include loss of my internet access for some time.
